Home Garden Variety Trials for 2021

Now in our 5th year, we are excited to continue this engaging and TN gardener-focused citizen-science program. Gardeners across the state can team up with us in Extension to trial and evaluate paired selections of common garden crops. GARDENING CALENDAR



February

Trim bushes, evergreen hedges. Prepare seed beds. Chit potato tubers. Direct seed English peas, mustard, kale, and collards. Seed early warm-season transplants. Dormant prune blueberry canes



March

Plant fruit trees or plants.
Remove straw protection from strawberries. Sow seed for warm weather transplants.
Trim winter shrubs. Clean up around the garden. Plant shallots, onion sets, early potatoes and summerflowering bulbs

February 9, 2021

The Maury County Master Gardener Association, MCMGA, requests an exemption to conduct a plant sale, May 8, 2021 from 8 am to noon at the Baker Building in Columbia TN. We understand that an exemption is needed as the Plant Sale might have over 50 people at any one time. The Maury County Master Gardeners intend to implement protection and safety guidelines established to combat COVID-19.

The MCMGA annual Plant Sale is the Association's only fund raiser for the year. Proceeds from the sale are used to fund community service projects and other Association events and activities. The event was canceled in 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions. The sale is an opportunity for our members to learn more about growing and propagating plants and at the same time, benefiting our community by encouraging gardening and providing healthy, locally grown plants.

The sale generally consists of plants grown by the county Master Gardeners and displayed on about 21 tables arranged in three rows of seven. The building is large and has doors at each end large enough to fit farm equipment.

The sale is a one-day event and is open from 8 am until noon. As many as 30 master gardeners and helpers work the day before the sale to organize, clean, and place plastic covering over the tables and place the plants with identification tags in the plant pots. After the sale some of the helpers will remove unsold plants, clean and break down tables, and clean the building as needed.

Food is not sold at this event.

The restrooms will be closed to the public.

The number of people attending the Maury County Master Gardener Plant Sale typically varies with about 100 total shoppers attending during the four hours of the sale. Since shoppers come and go there may not be as many as 50 shoppers at any one time. The overall display of plants occupies less than one fourth of the floor space in the building with ample space to spread out.

The large doors at each end of the building will remain open during the sale. The large doors and open floor space permit great air circulation and make social distancing easier to accommodate. People will enter on one end of the building and exit on the opposite end. Master Gardeners will be asked to use a smaller door on the front of the building.

Tables with plants will be spaced at least 12 feet apart.

The 3 or 4 vendors and one demonstration will be in separate spaces and located at least 10 feet apart.

Cashiers will be 8 feet apart from each other and over 10 feet apart from other activities. Stickers will be placed on the floor to indicate six feet of separation leading to cashiers.

All Master Gardeners will wear masks.

Signage will be posted reminding participants to social distance, sanitize, and wear masks.

Signs will be displayed at door entrances to encourage workplace safety. We will use the same signs used at the entrance to the Maury County Extension office.

Sanitizers will be placed around the room especially at the doors and at the checkout areas.

On behalf of the Maury County Master Gardeners and the future gardeners and the residents of Maury County, we thank you for your consideration in granting us the requested exemption.
