Vases or any watertight containers for our Mother's Day flower arranging.

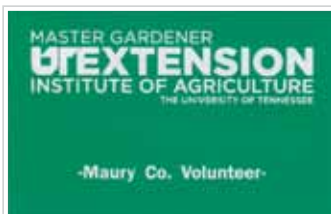

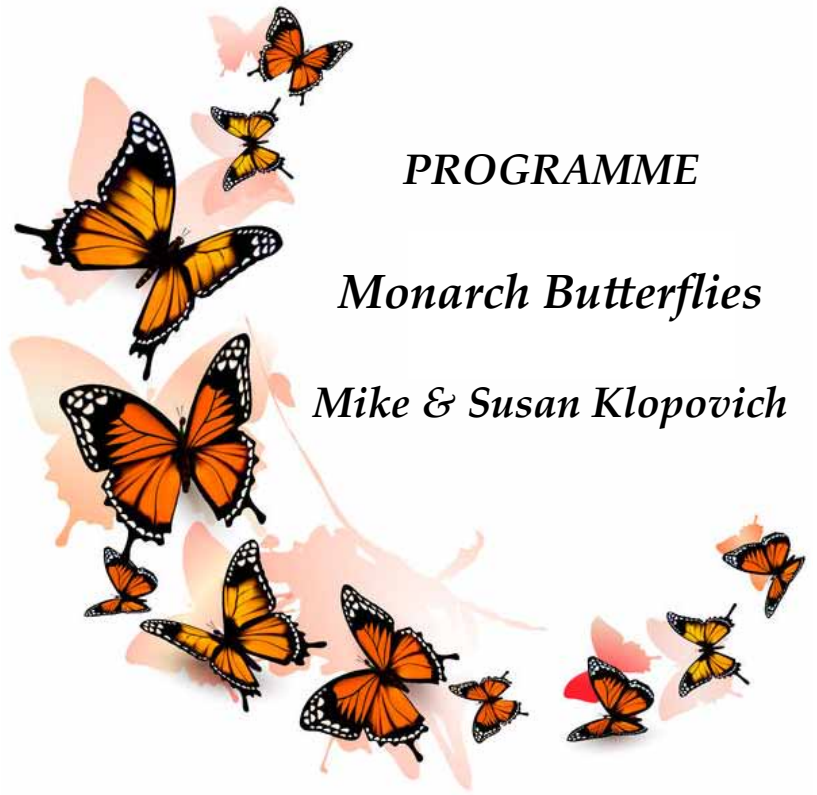
